My dear Mother, Father & all -

Rec'd. Dad's letter

from your last week and do hope that
Mama & Robert are entirely well by this
time. I'm very sorry to hear that the
Flu has broken out again in the States.
It's same over here, France has as
bad or worse epidemics than last fall &
in England its much worse. Its
certainly a dreadful disease when it
occurs in such pandemics.

We are expecting to leave this place
next Wed. But we may be at some
Park for a month or so, there I don't
know whether we get to come go back
with the Co, for few days ago I read a
Circular as Captain, & it looks as tho they
might not let me go for a mo or
so, but I'm just that much of
a pessimist you know. Red the little
little papers of mine Jim's, very good,
but I don't think Robert & rely on so well
hand in hand - understood.



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What I mean is, he can't take
all Baptists to be Rep or Rep to be
Baptists, thus if its a section
it won't be a political success, nor
a religious success. So you get
what I mean but I think he
might do lots of good + really
think it will be a success.
